Respectful Accommodations

Making your program accessible to children
with disabilities will require creative and
responsive accommodations. The Americans
with Disabilities Act (ADA) addresses the
necessity of making accommodations for
children with disabilities so that they can
participate in community
programs. This workshop
provides insight into what
constitutes a “respectful
accommodation” and specific
examples of accommodations
for children who have
various types of disabilities
are included.



Supporting Positive Behavior

All children display
some type of behavioral
challenge and some
children experience an
even more difficult time
of managing their
behavior - often times
this may be related to their disability.
Learn ways to prevent negative behaviors
before they occur and how to create
environments that offer positive behavior
support to children with behavioral
challenges.
