



Fire Marshal Urges Caution and Common Courtesy for 2011

The Snohomish County Fire Marshal's Office urges residents to use caution when discharging fireworks during the Fourth of July fireworks season and also to extend common courtesy to their neighbors by limiting the hours during which they discharge. Below is a general list of lawful discharge dates and times. Please contact your local jurisdiction to verify before discharging any fireworks.

Arlington	July 4 th between 9am – midnight
Bothell	July 4 th between 9am – 11pm
Brier	July 4 th between 9am – 11:59pm
Darrington	July 4 th between 9am – 11:59pm
Edmonds	Banned
Everett	Banned
Gold Bar	Banned
Granite Falls	July 4 th between 9am – midnight
Index	July 4 th between 9am – 11:59pm on private property only
Lake Stevens	July 4 th between 9am - midnight
Lynnwood	July 4 th between 9am – 11pm
Marysville	July 4 th between 9:00am - 11pm
Mill Creek	Banned
Monroe	July 4 th between 9am - midnight
Mountlake Terrace	Banned
Mukilteo	Banned
Snohomish County (unincorporated)	July 4 th between 9am – 11:59pm
Stanwood	June 28 th – July 5 th between noon – 11pm
Sultan	State Law*
Woodway	Banned

*RCW 70.77.935 (State Law)

June 28	between noon- 11pm
June 29 – July 3	between 9am – 11pm
July 4	between 9am – midnight
July 5	between 9am – 11pm

Many fireworks purchased on reservations are not legal for discharge off reservation property. Illegal fireworks include bottle rockets, missile-type rockets, firecrackers and chasers as well as M80s, M100s and larger.
